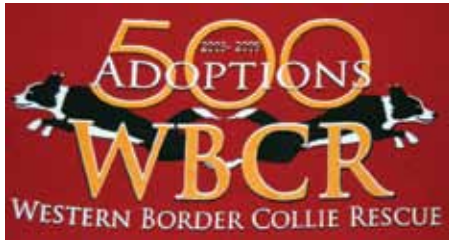


WBCR CELEBRATES 500 ADOPTIONS

A STRING OF PEARLS - WBCR Takes in Many Special Needs Dogs in early 2010

As some of you may know, the second half of 2009 was both extremely rewarding and extremely difficult for WBCR. While we were able to help more BCs in need than ever before, we also were nearly overwhelmed with rescued dogs who had major medical issues. We hoped our run on special needs dogs would end with the close of 2009, but that was not the case!

2010 began with a petite little BC girl named Cotton who shortly after arriving from a CO shelter, began showing strange and painful symptoms including intermittent joint inflammation and pain, and cluster seizures in the first days of the new year. After many vet appointments and tests, it was discovered that Cotton has an immune-mediated arthritis along with idiopathic seizures.



Next Bing arrived from a UT shelter with a life-threatening case of antibiotic-resistant pneumonia that took three months and multiple vet visits to treat effectively.

Next came sweet little Jazmine who arrived from a NM shelter severely malnourished, heartworm positive, and with an old dislocated hip injury. She soon developed pneumonia as well.



On the heels of these major vet bills came our next catastrophe – fabulous Ian was attacked by coyotes and suffered life-threatening injuries, needing immediate and inpatient medical attention to save his life.



Then the tiny and vulnerable “N pups” (Nick, Nudge and Nyx) pups arrived from a KS shelter with severe parasitic infestations (both coccidia and giardia), and the next incoming puppies, Oliver and Olivia from a NM shelter, contracted parvo shortly after their rescue. We’re confident we are now on a first name basis with every vet between Albuquerque, Salt Lake City and Fort Collins, and have done our part to help put their grandkids through college! It was an extremely stressful few months and almost too crazy to be believed, but we are happy to report all have recovered and are happy, healthy dogs now!



Alas - not all our special needs cases were so fortunate. Despite the best veterinary care and the heroic efforts of their foster parents, Buster, a darling young pup from an ID shelter, lost a battle with distemper earlier this winter, and tiny Norman of the N pups did not survive a perforated intestine. Our only consolation is knowing that although their lives were cut way too short, we were able to help both Norman and Buster finally know the love and safety that every dog deserves.

And all along, sweet Raena has been waiting her turn for some medical attention. Raena came from a UT shelter last fall with an old fracture on her left front leg. It was definitely a pretty traumatic injury as it not only caused her ‘ankle’ to angle far outside of her leg, but also stretched and tore all of the ligaments to a point beyond repair.



While her injury is certainly not life-threatening, it definitely impacts her quality of life. At just 3 years old, we feel it’s in her best interest to be able to spend the rest of her life being able to play fetch (her faaaaaavorite pastime!) absolutely pain-free. Thanks to the generosity of Dr. Felix Duerr of Aspen Meadows Vet Clinic and Paws of The Rockies Vet Clinic in Fort Collins, we will be able to get Raena’s surgery at a significantly reduced amount, and will be scheduling that as soon as our ‘wallet’ recovers a bit!

As you can imagine, all of these expenditures have put a huge drain on our finances. Please help us continue to treat these dogs with special needs donating to The Dash Fund, an account set up for extraordinary veterinary needs. For more on The Dash Fund, please turn to page 4.

THE OKLAHOMA DOGS ARE A-OK!

Our OK dogs:

As many of you may recall, WBCR rescued 6 Border Collies/ BC mixes from a horrible hoarding situation in Oklahoma last summer where 127 dogs were seized, most of them in horrible physical and mental condition. We are thrilled to report that "The Oklahoma 6" all have since physically and mentally healed, and are all now living in their forever homes!! We touched base with a few of their adoptive families, and here's what they had to say about their furry family members:



A "fan favorite", Merritt has made an amazing transition from sick and emaciated to vibrant and well, a bit of a "musk ox".

From Mercy's adopter: Although still a shy and cautious girl, Mercy is thriving in her loving forever home. She enjoys going for walks and is more confident when Mojo (her oh-so-handsome BC buddy!) is along. She recently enjoyed an 8-mile hike, and is realizing the world is a pretty great place to be! When she's relaxing at home, she loves having her tummy rubbed and although she rarely solicits attention, she will nudge you or make a dramatic plea for a rub by rolling on her back and sticking her legs straight up in the air -- very silly! It's been wonderful to have a dog to share my life with again - life really didn't seem complete without one. Mercy is a funny kid - she really doesn't make any demands, but I can tell that she appreciates having a home, regular meals and some human affection, and I am thrilled that I am the one to provide her with those things. I have come to appreciate Mercy's unique personality. She really is the sweetest and most gentle dog I've known.



From Ruby's family: Ruby is a wonderful girl who has changed my life in unexpected ways.....I work with autistic children, and have become so much more aware of their sensitivities thanks to Ruby. When I see Ruby hesitate at a door, withdraw from coming near because there is activity behind me, or reacting fearfully to a new sound, or a door opening or closing, suddenly now I am so much more aware at school of how scary an environment can be. This has increased my sensitivity to just how busy our worlds are, and how we need to give shy animals and people the opportunity to feel safe by accepting them as they are, but also helping them be all they can be. Ruby, a dog who not that long ago was struggling for survival with 120+ other dogs without any human attention/ connection, has taught me this. Thanks to Ruby, my children with heightened sensitivities have found an island in the room we work in of more calm and more acceptance...thank you Ruby!!



From Callie's family: Callie has become more confident since that first day we brought her home and has settled in well with all of us. She connected quickly with our golden retriever and they both enjoy each other's company. This was important to us because our golden is an older dog. Callie has such a sweet disposition that she fit right in and enjoys all the walks, hugs and fetching we do. Although we didn't have Callie as a puppy, it's been a joy watching her evolve and progress. We've observed her responses to new situations (previously not exposed to) and teaching her along the way. The best part is that every day we learn something new about each other and that makes it exciting. We're looking forward to many years of fun and continued laughter with Callie.



MORE SPECIAL NEEDS DOGS

WHISPER AND LADD

The OK dogs reiterated a valuable lesson we see again and again in rescue - that given enough time, many "unadoptable" dogs can be rehabilitated and integrated into loving forever homes.

So we again did not hesitate to step forward and offer assistance when, early this spring, over 100 dogs and other animals were seized from a "rescue" that had quickly degenerated into a hoarding situation in rural Wyoming. Several of the dogs were BCs, and 2 of them soon arrived into WBCR.



Darling little Whisper and sweet Ladd had lived nothing but a life of neglect and fear and likely had never even been touched by people in a good way. Two months later, both have made great strides and are a far cry from the terrified, cowering creatures whose only hope was WBCR. Ladd, allegedly Whisper's father, is the older of the two and is still quite shy. At 4 years old, we expect him to take a little longer to come around, although he has quickly befriended another dog in his foster home and has recently begun to play and enjoy life. We are surprised and delighted that beautiful little Whisper (who is only 1 1/2) settled into life in a foster home quickly, and has already been adopted!



THE DASH FUND



WBCR is committed to helping all kinds of BCs in need. Our expansion has brought an increase in rescues, and that increase in rescues means an increase in dogs with a variety of special needs. To address this, the Dash Fund was established this year, named in honor of a very special BC boy who arrived at WBCR in early 2009 and shortly after, contracted distemper. Despite his best efforts, the finest in veterinary care, and the incredible love and care of his foster and adoptive families, Dash did not survive. However, his memorable delight for life remains with us, and the Dash Fund was created so that WBCR can offer the same level of care to other incoming rescues needing extra special attention and/or extraordinary vet care to ensure the best chance at a new life. CLOVER

And lest we forget - there is one other nearly feral BC that has come into WBCR recently - darling Clover! After living all by herself in a NE sunflower field for months using an old culvert for shelter, some kind people were finally able to trap this tiny girl and took her to a local vet, who called WBCR to help.



Clover came to WBCR last fall and before long was kicking up her heels and learning to trust people. Clover is now ready to move into a foster home where she can receive more one-on-one time to help her learn the skills necessary to be a very adoptable canine companion. Clover is a petite little lass who loves to play with dogs and toys and shows a lot of natural herding instinct. She's still got a ways to go in the confidence-building department, but if you are interested in helping a shy dog learn about the wonders of life, consider fostering Clover!
